underserved. Two on site mega health camps were conducted in nearby tribal areas. In an effort to be of service to the poor and particularly the elderly, the hospital provided outpatient services in nine outlying villages in 2019.

Christian Education

AIM provides Christian education for grades one through ten. In addition, Preston Junior College offers a two-year junior college degree program. A teaching staff of 12 and non-teaching staff of 2 provided services to 105 students at Preston Junior College. Agape Good Shepherd High School enrolled 305 students in both English and Telugu medium. The school is run by 19 teaching and 3 non-teaching staff.

Ten students are enrolled in a two-year pre-nursing program provided by Preston Junior College. This degree is the equivalent of a nurse's assistant degree in America.

The Institute of Spiritual Formation and Community Transformation is a two-year Bible College started by AIM in 2016. Currently there are 20 active students trained by a staff of four. The students live off campus and come in for scheduled weekly training sessions. The purpose is to prepare and train students for a career in pastoral ministry, church planting and missions.

Remarks

You will note on the GSSB Income Statement included in this report an additional entity in 2019, that being "Abundant Life Churches" with grants of \$127,223. These grants were funded entirely by Outreach Map, a 501 (c) (3) charity located in the State of California. Outreach MAP and its mission station in India are under the leadership and direction of Paul and Caroline Wig. Paul and Caroline are the son in law and daughter of Mr. and Mrs. K M John. Their mission activities are in the States of Telangana, Maharastra and Chhatisgrah, India. They oversee 123 pastors and church planters, 135 weekly worship centers, 140 house churches.

Agape Interfaith Ministries International was organized in 2001 as a 501 (c) (3) charity. The business model begins with the premise that this is God's mission directed by His Spirit; we are His servants. The model seeks to maximize the donors purpose; that being his or her support of a mission. Everyone is a missionary. Officers and directors serve at their own expense. Travel to and from India is borne by the traveler. The only asset AIM has is a bank account which is held mostly in directed funds. No office space is owned or rented, officers and directors work out of their homes. The only rent AIM pays for is a post office box and a safe deposit box. AIM's goal is to be transparent with our supporters and partners; therefore, included in every annual report will be an income statement and a balance sheet.

AIMs sister organization, Agape Interfaith Ministries (AIM India) is located in Jangaon, Telangana, India. AIM India is a charitable umbrella organization that oversees, facilitates and operates all the ministries discussed in this report. AIM India is also registered with the government of India under the "Foreign Contribution Regulation Act, 1976" (FCRA). To get this registration is time consuming ie several years and often difficult for Christian organizations. The registration allows AIM India to receive foreign funding without any taxation. AIM India's books and financial records are audited annually by a certified public accounting firm.

Child Evangelism

Summer Bible Schools were conducted in 7,241 villages in 2019. This is a major undertaking for AIM India who partners with other like-minded churches and faith-based organizations covering 52 counties in the states of Maharashtra, Orissa, Chatsghad, Karnataka, Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. These events take place in the hottest parts of the summer when public schools are closed. Planning and training begin in February with 24,040 teachers trained. As a result, 867,708 children received the Gospel; 501,474 would be considered non-Christian children and 531,728 children were attending for the first time. In addition, 104,962 adult parents attended. Seven hundred eleven new churches were planted.

A second ministry in the area of child evangelism is after school Bible Clubs. These clubs meet daily after school. Students receive assistance in their school studies, have a Bible study, participate in recreational activities and receive treats. Hindu village leaders value education very highly and are accepting of these clubs for the reason that club leaders are willing to help students in their academics in addition to other activities. It is estimated that once a village the after-school club is organized; the village will be ready for a junior church plant in 18 months. The results of these activities in 2019 were, 222 students experienced behavioral changes due to these activities. Fifty four children and adults received baptism. AIM India in partnership with Mission India facilitates the operation of 40 clubs and in addition operates 16 after-school Bible Clubs independently.

Dayanilayam Orphanage

Dayanilayam (house of mercy) orphanage was home to 215 girls and boys in 2019. The children live in separate structures and dine in a common area. The children are total orphans, semi orphans, children abandoned by their families, and poorest of the poor families who cannot afford to care for their children at home. They come from tribal areas, down trodden slum and rural areas and other poor cast backgrounds from 17 counties in Telangana State.

Home for the Aged

Renovation and repair work on Anna Unruh Home for the Aged was completed in 2018. A compound wall was built, the premises are now secure from animals and trespassers. Additional coconut trees and flowering shrubs were planted which makes the grounds pleasant and beautiful. Ten elders now reside there with an additional eight for daycare. Residents are blessed with morning devotions, worship, prayer, good food, and a good place to rest. The complex has its own water well, fruit trees and gardens. The home has one care taker and one cook.

Medical Ministry

Health care disparities, loss of life due to poor and low-value care in India is pervasive in rural India. Elders have become the most neglected population in rural India as well as urban areas. AIM is bringing hope to rural residents through medical ministry and elder care ministry. People are experiencing God's love through these ministries. AIM operates The Mary Louise Memorial Hospital. This is a small rural hospital in the village of Tharigoppula. A staff of 1 doctor, 1 full time nurse, one full time pharmacist, 2 full time helpers delivered treatment to 705 patients in 2019. AIM is collaborating with Unicorpus Health Foundation in the city of Hyderabad for specialized and advanced care for patients from the villages. The doctors in Unicorpus have a Christian world view and a great passion to serve the

Annual Report 2019

Introduction

This report will center on the mission activities of Agape Interfaith Ministries International (AIM) primarily in the state of Telangana, India in the year 2019. Jesus said in Matthew 9:37 "The harvest truly is plentiful, but the laborers are few". This seems to be the case in 2019 with a real yearning for the Hope the Gospel of Jesus Christ gives. Again, God was faithful in granting physical protection and the window of opportunity remains open in many areas of this ministry. We are grateful for God's provision to reach and serve the poorest of the poor in this land.

Background

The targeted people group are India's Dalits, commonly known as the "untouchables" in the social system. The main geographical area that AIM serves is the State of Telangana. This region covers 44,000 square miles of hot, dry interior land with a year-round growing season and an abundant, rechargeable ground water supply. This is home to 35+ million people, 70% who get their livelihood from agriculture and live in hundreds of rural villages. The main religions are Hindu, 89%, Muslim, 9%, and Christian 2%. Thirty four percent of the population are illiterate and the average age is 25 years. During British rule until 1953, Telangana was ruled by Muslim sultans and was considered a backward area. The main city in Telangana and capital city is Hyderabad with eleven million people. Hyderabad is a high-tech center with a state of the art regional airport. The rural villages, city slums and beggar communities in this region are the main areas AIM serves.

Evangelism and Church Planting

In 2019 seventy-five pastors and sixteen Bible women were under AIM's umbrella of support. These pastors and Bible women have a total of 152 organized churches under their care. Twenty-one of these pastors have sponsors and the remainder are supported out of a common fund. As a result of their efforts 192 new believers were baptized and joined the AIM family in 2019. Thirty two churches and 201 house churches were planted in 2019. In addition, 221 women's prayer cells are organized to run every day in addition to weekly cottage prayer meetings.

Only three churches have an onsite parsonage. Pastors who do not have an onsite parsonage to live in must rent living quarters likely from a non-Christian landlord. This also may be some distance from the churches they serve thus creating a problem with transportation. Several of our pastors have no personal motorized transportation and are in need of a motorcycle. It needs to be noted that the people groups AIM seeks to serve low cast individuals, the poorest of the poor. This system is deeply embedded in the culture of rural India and is not likely to change soon. Although India is an emerging third world country with a rising standard of living, this occurrence is bypassing these low cast people groups leaving them in their plight of poverty. Therefore, we present these needs to the reader.

Update on the Potential Mission Trip to India this Year:

Last year after our trip to India, I was wondering how much longer missionaries would be able to get into India based on our experiences and the government's desire to deter missions work. No one had any idea that travel into India would not be stopped by the government based on religion, but rather a pandemic virus. We have made tentative travel plans to visit India and AIM Missions for this December. As you may or may not be aware, travel at this point into India is not possible. I spoke to a travel agent yesterday and she is hopeful that travel booking will be opened back up by the end of July to the first of August. That is still approximately 4 months before the trip would occur. The other underlying factor is the resurgence of the virus that we are seeing lately. So, we have decided to release tentative dates and pricing for anyone that feels called to go on the trip this year so you can plan accordingly and I will keep everyone updated as I receive new information. The dates in December have been chosen to coincide with the wedding of KM John's granddaughter and may be modified based on wedding plans or travel needs. Please continue to pray for the mission, the level of your commitment and the opportunities for sharing the gospel in India. Feel free to contact me if you have any questions
